

Tom Allen, MD, Fellow, IOMC & Executive Medical Director, BCBS of IL

Dr. Tom Allen currently is an Executive Medical Director of Behavioral Health, Government Programs, at Health Care Service Corporation, and chief psychiatrist for the BCBS Medicaid program in Illinois. After graduating from college at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, he completed medical school, along with a residency in psychiatry and a fellowship in hospice and palliative medicine, at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine in Chicago. He worked for approximately ten years as a psychiatrist in community mental health and private practice before transitioning to managed care. He is board-certified in both psychiatry and hospice and palliative medicine.

Tarig Butt, MD, VP of Health Affairs, ACCESS Community Health Network

Dr. Tariq Butt has served in his current position since 2013 and has been on the frontlines of community-based healthcare delivery as a board-certified family physician, administrator, and advocate for the underserved. In 2021, Dr. Joshi was recognized by the Institute of Medicine Chicago with an award for his leadership in public health during the COVID-19 pandemic.
