- Discuss other opportunities for the AMA to further efforts to improve mental health and wellness, and reduce the potential for burnout among medical students and residents

Overview

At Annual 2022, mental health was recognized as a crisis by the AMA House of Delegates and its importance was highlighted as one of the pillars of the AMA Physician Recovery Plan to reduce physician burnout. In conclusion to a review of aggregated ACGME data on 381,614 residents in training from the year 2000 to 2014 by Nicholas Yaghmour *et al.*, suicide was the leading cause of death for cis-male residents and the second leading cause of death for cis-female residents. According to the AMA CME at the Annual 2019 meeting, medical students are three times likelier to die of suicide than their counterparts in the general population.

This crisis is longstanding, even prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, and will not be single-handedly solved by improving access to mental health services or wellness

programs. In this session, AMA leaders will share their personal experiences navigating undergraduate and graduate medical education and discuss new ways through which we should approach the solution to the mental health crisis faced by those who are the future of medicine.

TOWNHALL: FINDING COMMON GROUND IN CONVERSATIONS ON HEALTH EQUITY, RACE & MEDICINE

The 2022 Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization created an acute-on-chronic exacerbation of polarization in America on medical topics. The upcoming Supreme Court decisions on affirmative action and race /ethnicity as a factor in admissions is one example of among several legal changes under consideration at state and federal levels that are expected to increase already-high levels of polarization.

The AMA Minority Affairs Section will hold a town hall meeting during the 2023 Annual Meeting to seek common ground on controversial, polarizing issues involving race in medicine and public health. The town hall will include a moderated panel featuring AMA physician leaders followed by a small group exercise among audience members. The goal is to draw upon the strengths and creativity of medical students, residents, and physicians to identify ways to mitigate polarization across various controversial topics that strongly impact the future of our American healthcare system.
